

# LOCAL ECONOMIC IMPACT\*

(Fiscal Year 2009)

Military and civilian employees at McConnell AFB to include the 22 ARW, 184 ARW and 931 ARG earned approximately \$247.8 million for use in the local area during Fiscal Year 2009 (FY09). An additional \$110.8 million was spent for base operations support, military construction, and health care.\*\*

Another measure of economic significance is the number of indirect jobs created. These are the additional retail, service, wholesale, and construction jobs that exist in the community because of the base. An estimated 2,289 of these secondary jobs were sustained in FY09. As a result of the payroll earnings of these secondary jobs, McConnell AFB generates an additional \$96.1 million in indirect payroll earnings. The total impact on McConnell AFB and its tenant wing and group on the local economy was \$453.6 million.
